Introduction

On April 8, 2024, a total solar eclipse will occur in the United States. The eclipse will travel over the majority of Indiana, with Santa Claus, IN and surrounding areas in Spencer County directly in the path of totality. An estimated 34 million people live in the path of totality in the United States. Heavy traffic into or near the path of totality is expected, especially in the Midwest region. Hosting such a large event will require a fullscale community effort and months of planning prior to its occurrence.

The tasks identified for this project:


- Modeling and predicting the volume of visitors coming to Spencer County

Visitor Projections


Accurate visitation projections are essential to properly plan for the 2024 Eclipse Event. Inaccurate projections could result in:

- Over-projecting unnecessary spending and staffing
- **Under-projecting** not enough visitor resources

An accurate projection gives Santa Claus, IN ample time to plan for all potential scenarios.

The community eclipse website will be a landing page for the county's residence as well as any prospective visitors to the area. The website will provide information from the categories below:











Overnight Visitor in Campgrounds


Visitors Grouped Based on Driving Distance and Lodging
